Willis, who handled the negotiations with the performers for S.A.B.U. said he was unaware that such close contact should be maintained with the E.C. about the use of the funds.

According to Willis, the first contact with Baraka came during exams and the deal was not concluded until the end of last week.
"I don't know what could have been done," he said.

The appearance of Baraka, which costs considerably more than Young, was made possible in part by $\$ 250$ contributed by the Glasgow Endowment Commitlee. The money is in addition to $\$ 300$ given by the Endowment Conamittee last term.

In other business, the E.C. voted to : ive the Jazz Ensemble \$177 to complete the amount needed to bring Maynard Ferguson, said to be the top jazz trumpeteer on the East coast, to campus on Jan. 20.

The money will supplement funds given by the Music Department, R.O.T.C., an earlier pledge from the E.C., and over $\$ 100$ donated personally by the members of the Jazz Ensemble.

Ferguson's appearance on the 20th of this month will be in Lee Chapel at 8 p.m. Admission is free.
